The Constitution provides that an amendment may be proposed either by the Congress with a two-thirds majority vote in both the House of Representatives and the Senate or by a constitutional convention called for by two-thirds of the State legislatures. None of the 27 amendments to the Constitution have been proposed by constitutional convention.

How to Amend the Constitution—About the Process

Although not specifically mentioned in the document, there are five unofficial yet legal ways of changing the Constitution used more often—and sometimes even more controversially—than the Article V amendment process. These include legislation, presidential actions, federal court rulings, actions of the political parties, and simple custom.

There are two main ways that the interpretation of the Constitution changes, and hence its meaning. The first is simply that circumstances can change. One prime example is the extension of the vote.

3 Ways to Amend the Constitution

One way to amend the constitution is by proposing a new amendment in congress and then ratifying the amendment in $\frac{3}{4}$ of the states. In Congress, the amendment must have at least ? majority support from both the House of Representatives and the Senate to be proposed, and then it must be debated and passed by a joint resolution.
